Electronic pay stubs (e-stubs): The way of the future

Saving money, paper and time

Dear Colleague:

While many private companies, corporations and state governments like Florida, Idaho, Kentucky, South Dakota and Nebraska have the option of receiving employee pay stubs electronically (e-stubs), surprisingly, the federal government does not offer this option to all federal employees. Offering all federal employees the option of receiving their pay stubs electronically can save taxpayers millions every year. In fact, a study conducted in Idaho found that paper stubs cost ten times more than e-stubs: \$.30 vs. \$.03.

E-stubs not only save money, paper and time, they are also safer than sending pay stubs via ground mail: reducing the chance of them getting lost or falling into the wrong hands.


Why this bill is a sensible idea

- This bill can save taxpayers millions of dollars annually
- E-stubs ensure on time delivery of payroll information
- E-stubs do not include social security numbers or addresses, making them more secure and less susceptible to identity theft than hand-delivered paper copies
- Federal employees will have the option of opting-in to begin receiving their pay stubs electronically
- This bill will save immeasurable amounts of paper

Moving forward with technological advances means going paperless with pay stubs as so many employers already have done. Federal employees should be allowed the option of receiving their pay stubs electronically and this bill will allow all federal employees to do just that.
